Queen of the South Football Club is a Football Club for all, promoting diversity, treating everyone equally regardless of their background, age, culture, disability, gender, language, racial origin, socio-economic status, religious belief and/or sexual identity. Everyone has the right to protection from all forms of harm and abuse and Queen of the South Football Club is committed to achieving this through the implementation of this policy.

Football should be a safe and enjoyable experience for all, the implementation of this policy allows us to protect children within the club to the best of our ability.
